Two major events have occurred this month that have and will improve our financial outlook. First, the membership of the Mill Valley Post made a sizable donation to our post. This covers our year-to-date deficit and positions us with a positive net of \$4,126 for the year. The second significant event is the negotiations with the Academy DeTurk. As some will recall, they rented our hall several years ago to run an after school program for school age children. We are looking for a long-term agreement with them. Their program will take place during the day and should not significantly impact our opportunities to rent the hall for evening and weekend events.

We still have significant capital improvements that need to be made to our facilities, such as lighting for the hall and new heating systems for the hall and bar. The Post will be prioritizing such improvements and moving forward to accomplish them.
