The presentation concluded with distribution of flags and rulers illustrated with photos of all the United States Presidents. This program is very well received by schools. Members are invited to join us in a very worthwhile, satisfying, and fun-filled activity.

**Memorial Day.** An extensive program honoring those who have died in the service of our country was presented at the Civic Center Auditorium Monday, May 28, with ceremonies, music, and an address by Colonel Jeffrey W. Magram. We moved outside for a wreath service, a presentation of a French Legion of Honor Award, a military vehicle display, and a very special presenta-



tion. Jim Clark, a retired Captain of the Larkspur Fire D e p a r t m e n t, member of the Marin County Search and Rescue Team, and a frequent volunteer in areas of the world devas-

tated by severe catastrophes (like the Indonesian tsunami and the Haitian earthquake), some years ago noticed that the name of a family friend was missing from the Marin County World War II Memorial. He was Ross resident Marine Private Harvey Irvin Long, who lost his life at the Tarawa Atoll on November 20, 1943. Jim brought this omission to the attention of the Veterans Council, who added his name to the Memorial. Jim was very happy to speak about Private Long and to present a wreath in his honor. Coffee and doughnuts were served to all following the ceremonies.
