Heroism on Mount Tam. Pat Williams was working at the West Point Inn on the mountain on Sunday and as he was standing on the deck, a bicycle rider yelled up to him that a man was in trouble below him. The man was walking down from the Mountain Play on the trail. Pat grabbed his five minuet bag (has medical supplies) and the New AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) that they had just purchased and ran down to him. He found a gentleman slumped over the table without a pulse and cyanotic (turning blue) so he started CPR and then hooked up the AED and proceeded to give a series of three shocks. On the third shock the man came around and started breathing on his own and had a pulse. He had someone call 911 when he started, and Southern Marin Fire arrived on scene and transported him to the ER. Pat went to visit him later on in the hospital where he was recovering.

Eric, husband of Sarah Jane and father of Caleb and Elizabeth, participates in weekly meetings and monthly camping trips, teaches both outdoor and emergency skills, and, as webmaster, built and maintains the Troop website and mailing list. He participates in Boy Scout community service projects such as Scouting for Food and Coastal Clean Up. He teaches Merit Badge classes in technology and emergency preparedness. This year he is the Pancake Breakfast Chairman. He and his fellow Scouts will be canoeing for nine days in the boundary waters of Minnesota and Canada as part of the High Adventure program. His goal with all of his work is to provide the framework for boys to become leaders.

During his military service, Eric served as an undesignated Airman aboard the *U.S.S. Guadalcanal, LPH-7* out of Norfolk, Virginia, in 1992 – 1993. As a member of the flight deck crew aboard this "Gator Freighter," he and the 750 other crewmen were tasked to deliver their 2,000 Marines where they were needed. Although he served during Operation Provide Comfort II, Eric did not see combat. Rather, he saw a great deal of the shipyards while his ship was retrofitted as well as the Atlantic and Caribbean for training exercises, during which he spent weeks working twenty hour shifts every day as the "lower operator," the only enlisted person in the primary flight control tower.

Post 313 Receives Plaque for Team Sponsorship.


