A few days later, on the morning of July 11, with a slightly larger group, they played ceremonial and military music for the change of command and reception at the Coast Guard Air Station in San Francisco. That enormous hangar made quite a concert hall.

Traveling Freedom Wall. A 360 foot, 80% scale replica of the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C., honoring WWII, Korean, Vietnam, Afghanistan, and Iraq veterans, is coming to Sonoma November 7 - 11, 2012 as part of the Cost of Freedom Tribute. There will also be a special 9/11 tribute and a Gold Tag Wall with the names of all fallen heroes since the Global War on Terrorism began. Additionally, a special observation will be held to recognize Firefighters and Law Enforcement Officers on Friday, November 9<sup>th</sup> starting at 1:00 p.m. These tributes will be presented by Veterans of Foreign Wars at the Sonoma Valley Veterans Memorial Building, 126 First Street West, Sonoma, California. At that time also, Chapter 78, Military Order of the Purple Heart and the Vietnam Veterans of American Chapter 223 will unveil a new exhibit in honor of POW/MIAs.

This extraordinary event, expecting a crowd of 5,000 people, will also include counseling services, computer locator services for the memorials, a mini job fair, and a VA mobile information van to assist and answer questions for veterans in need.
