The 63rd Annual Pancake Breakfast was a huge success. Over 1,000 hungry people joined us for breakfast. The Scouts continue to do a great job on this event, by far their largest fundraiser. Also, our Gin Fizz booth did exceptionally well. A big Thank You to everyone who helps this occasion remain the biggest event in Larkspur.

For the Hall, we recently upgraded our lighting. The chandeliers, which are 40's vintage, received a much needed overhaul. New LED bulbs were installed along with completion of general maintenance. Now we have the same chandeliers that everyone likes but they run like brand new chandeliers. The Hall is brighter now and we will benefit long term with lower energy costs.

It's August and we are into a new membership year. Yippee!!! Please send in your renewals early and help us get through this annual project. My door is always open.

#### **Finance**

We are now half way through 2015. The first half has seen significant expenditures: new clubroom carpet and cabinets as well as lighting in the Hall. In addition, we lost 9 weeks of Hall rental income due to the overhaul of the bathroom, not to mention the cost of the bathrooms. As of June 30, we have fallen below our stated reserve of \$70,000 to \$63,000. This shortfall is temporary in nature, and I believe we'll find ourselves above stated reserve in the near future.

#### Membership

Our Post receives \$6.50 of the \$35 in dues each of you pay. \$13.50 goes to National and \$15.00 to District. We use our share along with rental income to provide:

- Veterans dinners & entertainment, like singers
- Coffee/pastries Monday and Thursday
- Hospitality at Monthly General meetings
- Vets BBQ
- Charitable donations
