It has been just about a month since the California Department took possession of its new building in Sanger, and also began the process of transitioning to a new Dept. CA website and Facebook page.

As of Sat., 08-August, 2015, Dept. CA had completed the physical move from offices in San Francisco to the new office in Sanger; Dept. CA no longer has a physical presence in San Francisco.

Here's what Dept. CA has been doing and what we will be doing:

Forwarding address to the Sanger location given to the SF Post Office – forward good for six (6)months

Phones have been changed out and new numbers available

Physical office equipment to be kept, and all items in storage, have been moved to Sangerspace

Remodel of the former bank building is now underway:

The parking lot has been completely resurfaced and restriped;

New bathrooms with new fixtures are now being installed;

Office furniture is being ordered (almost brand new from a wholesaler to reduce costs)

An office layout plan has been prepared, and is currently being finalized;
