I come from a long line of soldiers that has not skipped a generation since the Civil War. Both my Grandfathers served in WWII, one was a Sea Bee that served in the Pacific making landing strips for plans is about all I know he die when I was young and my grandmother said he never really spoke of the war, he left my dad 2 swords and a 8.8 rifle and a rising sun flag that was passed down to me. My other Grandfather served as a MP in a prison in Okinawa and he helped raise me from the time I was 6 years old. He handed down to me a M1 Carbine and a short sword that belonged to my great uncle that was a Marine corps Sniper who was at some of the beach heads. My dad was Air Force Commando and a door gunner on Puff serving two tours. Then there is me I'm a police officer on the civilian side with 23 years service and I did 4 years active duty Army with a counterdrug unit, then went in reserves as a truck driver to get with a unit close to home. Got notification of deployment back in October and here I am slap dab in the middle of
