Post 313 will be hosting the 65th Annual Pancake Breakfast in Larkspur before the 4th of July Parade, with the Boy Scouts making and serving the breakfast and volunteers from the Post offering both gin fizzes with the secret recipe and hospitality to community members and membership to Veterans.

The Pancake Breakfast begins with the raising of the American flag at 0745, and the Mayor of Larkspur, Kevin Haroff, will make remarks. Let us use this opportunity to increase understanding of the Twin Cities Post, the American Legion, and the men and women who defend the United States of America on its birthday. There will be an American Legion color guard marching in the Larkspur parade, but it will be from Post 179. We could use some Veterans to re-form a color guard for our Post 313. Please contact me or other officers if you would like to be a member of the color guard. Last month we remembered D-Day and the generation, including Richie Guetter and Ralph Cole who served in World War II. What do we celebrate in July?

This country was founded in July, but as other historical moments in July remind us, America has always had to defend the Constitution, freedom and union which resulted from the events of July, 1776.

July 2, 1776 - The Continental Congress in Philadelphia adopted the following resolution, originally introduced on June 7, by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia: "Resolved, That these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved."

12 years later, **July 2, 1788** - Congress announced the United States Constitution had been ratified by the required nine states and that a committee had been appointed to make preparations for the new American government.

Of course, on **July 1, 1863** - The Battle of Gettysburg began during the American Civil War. That great battle preserved the Union that began in 1776 and was formally adopted in 1788.

We celebrate this whole process on **July 4**, **because on that date in 1776**, the Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress.

American Leadership also shows itself during July. **July 16**, **1945** - The experimental Atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off at 5:30 a.m. in the desert of New Mexico. A strong defense helps us keep from having to use such weapons ever again.

July 16, 1969 - The Apollo 11 Lunar Landing mission began with a liftoff from Kennedy Space Center at 9:37 a.m.

July 20, 1969 - A global audience watched on television as Apollo 11 Astronaut Neil Armstrong took his first step onto the moon. As he stepped onto the moon's surface he proclaimed, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind" - inadvertently omitting an "a" before "man" and slightly changing the meaning.

And a couple of wars appeared to end, but continued to simmer

July 20, 1954 - An agreement was signed in Geneva, Switzerland, ending hostilities between French forces in Vietnam and the People's Army of Vietnam. July 27, 1953 - The Korean War ended with the signing of an armistice by U.S. and North Korean delegates at Panmunjom, Korea. The war had lasted just over three years. A number of Post 313 members served during the Korean War, and continue to serve the Post and community today.

These events remind us that we must always be on guard, and find people willing to serve and defend

this country, from the time of Washington to today.
