# **Monthly Times**

We remember August for a number of historical events. These include the end of World War Two with V-J day on August 16. However, two other wars began on August 7: August 7, 1964 - Following an attack on two U.S. destroyers in the Gulf of Tonkin off North Vietnam, the U.S. Congress approved the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, granting President Lyndon B. Johnson authority "to take all necessary measures to repel any armed attack against the forces of the United States and to prevent further aggression." August 7, 1990 - Just five days after the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait, President George Bush ordered Desert Shield, a massive military buildup to prevent further Iraqi advances. Meanwhile, the Battle of Guadalcanal began with Marine landings August 7, 1942 in America's campaign to begin to retake the Pacific, a battle that would last for months. August was also a month for advances in democracy. On August 18, 1920 - The 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, granting women the right to vote. While on August 14, 1935 - President Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act establishing the system which guarantees pensions to those who retire at age 65. Besides beginning the escalation of American troops in Vietnam, on August 6, 1965 -The Voting Rights Act of 1965 was signed into law by President Johnson. I remember August 1969, because I walked into a tent near the Michelin rubber plantation to meet the members of Company A, 1<sup>st</sup> of the 18<sup>th</sup> infantry, 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division in Vietnam. It was a sweltering day and one of the troopers greeted me by saying, "You're my turtle." When I asked him

I was fortunate to be assigned to the First Infantry Division, the Big Red One, because it has always been one of the Army's best divisions. This year is the Centenary of the formation of the First Infantry Division, having been constituted May 24, 1917 in the Regular Army as Headquarters, 1st Expeditionary Division. Congratulations to the Big Red One and my hopes for another hundred years of service in defense of the United States both in war and in peace.
