KEN BURNS DOCUMENTARY ABOUT VI-ETNAM. There will be a documentary about Vietnam on PBS premiering September 17. By noted film producer Ken Burns, it will tell the story of American involvement in Vietnam 50 years ago. Previews indicate that it will provide a number of perspectives, ranging from Veterans to Vietnamese. Hopefully this will be a healing rather than dividing story, but only time will tell.

On a historical note, it is also the 100th Anniversary of America's entry into World War I leading to the formation of the American Legion. The Legion was based on the idea of the soldiers' group organized as the Grand Army of the Republic after the Civil War. One of the leading members of the newly formed American Legion in 1919 was Ogden Mills, an officer in the Army, whose father had a bank and had major connections to the San Francisco Bay Area – Mills Field was the first name of San Francisco's airport, and Millbrae is also related.

The President's recent announcement of a new strategy for Afghanistan and South Asia caused some commentators to remark that the current wars in Iraq and Afghanistan are forgotten. While some members of the population may have forgotten that we still have thousands of troops downrange in war zones or providing for the security of our allies, the American Legion, whose members served during many times of conflict, never forgets. We sent care packages to troops in Afghanistan, Iraq and Bahrain, including a Coast Guard cutter, Marines, and Army troops currently deployed.

Finally, as the disastrous Houston floods remind us, emergencies can occur with little notice. The National Guard, Coast Guard, and Reserves are assisting in the response to Houston flooding However, emergency preparedness can ease the burden of responding or surviving and helping others in such emergencies. There is CERT training in Novato October 10, 17, and Oct 21; and in Mill Valley Oct 28 and Nov 4. Even if you do not train to help first responders like the Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), you can prepare individuals and families with three basic steps.

- Build a support team of family, neighbors and friends
- Build an emergency kit: food, water, first aid, shoes
- Have a plan, for meeting, communications, response.

The American Legion supports the community, the nation, and the troops that defend us. This includes disaster preparedness and response.




