Did you know that there are specified days for public buildings to fly the POW/MIA flag including the US Capitol, other government buildings and US Post offices. These days are:

- Armed Forces Day on the third Saturday in May
- Memorial Day on the last Monday in May
- Flag Day on June 14
- Independence Day on July 4
- National POW/MIA Recognition Day third Friday in September
- Veterans' Day on November 11

Some states include Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day, March 30, Korean Armistice Day July 27, and Pearl Harbor Survivors Day Dec. 7. Maybe we should work toward adding these days to the list in California.

On March 3, 1863, President Lincoln established a system of national conscription. The draft prepared us for WWI and WWII, as well as Vietnam. Young men are still required to register for the Selective Service System.

In World War II, during March 1942, planning was underway for the April Doolittle Raid, learning to launch B-25s from a 500 foot runway. Army guys could take off, but not do carrier landings.
