Homeward Bound. Another local program that helps veterans is Homeward Bound of Marin. Homeward Bound reserves 16 beds for veterans. In a typical year, approximately 10 percent of homeless adults served by Homeward Bound of Marin are veterans. In the 2016-17 fiscal year, 93 veterans received services at Homeward Bound. Stephens' office is working with Homeward Bound to create permanent supportive housing for up to 25 homeless veterans on property adjacent to Homeward Bound.

We also support our troops around the world. There have been at least 4 casualties in recent weeks, so we know US troops continue to face danger as they support freedom and peaceful countries.

Post 313 has sent about 20 boxes to US troops in the last month, including a batch just sent out to arrive before Christmas, with decorations, cards, and jingle bells. At the last breakfast, we had people sign cards for the troops and sent about 20 individual Christmas cards, including one by Ava, age 8, and Pauline, age 110. See their photo below.

AMERICAN LEGION CHANGES POSSIBLE

If you received the American Legion Magazine for December you may already know this; there are changes proposed for Legion membership. Resolution 1 passed by the National Executive Committee calls on Congress to declare that the United States has been continuously engaged in a state of war from Dec. 7, 1941 to the present, and any active service member during that period would qualify to VA as a wartime veteran. Resolution 2, once Resolution 1 was approved by Congress, would allow membership to all Veterans from Dec. 7, 1941 to the date of cessation of armed hostilities as determined by the US Government.

What do you think of these proposals? Should we expand American Legion Membership to all who have served since December 7? It would increase the potential membership base, but all recent Veterans since 9/11 are already included.
