FINANCIAL STATUS AND CONTRIBUTIONS. Post 313 made steady progress toward more stable financial status, with the help of Chuck Heusser as Financial Officer. With multiple sources of rental income, we are slowly, but steadily, paying down the Bank of Marin credit line used to finance the office renovation. Because of our good payment history, the Bank of Marin has waived liquidity requirements which previously required a larger cash balance.

Post 313 also made contributions to good causes supporting the military and community. We support the Little League, the Fort Miley VA Volunteers, and the Marines Memorial Association of San Francisco's Gold Star parents support gathering.

booth before the Larkspur Corte Madera 4th of July Parade, along with members of the American Legion Color Guard for the Parade, and members of the Auxiliary including Pauline Angelman in a motorcycle sidecar. Tom Berns has worked to have Post 313 and its Hall included in the San Francisco Visitors and Convention Bureau website of facilities available for community rental and use, and we expect this effort to provide future rental occasions.
