We split the team up into small units all over the country to surgically support operations that are outside medevac rings. I sent your gifts to the team that is currently in our most austere site. They get hot chow every four days or so. They don't have creature comforts including heating/cooling or bathrooms! They are truly appreciative of gifts like yours. So much of what we do will never be seen. The people we do it for will never be met. It means everything to us to know that people like yourselves remember we are here and appreciate the sacrifices and work we do. Your team probably understands this better than anyone."
