Instead, the major culprit is close-up, person-toperson interactions for extended periods. Crowded events, poorly ventilated areas and places where people are talking loudly maximize the risk. These emerging findings are helping businesses and governments devise reopening strategies to protect public health while getting economies going again. That includes tactics like installing plexiglass barriers, requiring people to wear masks in stores and other venues, using good ventilation systems, and keeping windows open when possible.

Masks are available when using the Post 313 clubroom or bar. Use masks for an indoor gathering pursuant to the orders of the Governor and directions from local health departments. Hopefully by this time next year we will have a vaccine and all normal activities can resume.

Meanwhile, Bob Rogers has been doing yeoman work repairing and repainting the Bar in the Post 313 Bar area, and the Counter over the sink and dishwasher in the Clubroom. Thanks Bob, for all your work. See the pictures below of the repainted bar and clubroom counter.

A medical testing company, Lifeline Screening, rented the Post 313 Hall for a day for a series of tests: cholesterol, blood pressure, atrial fibrillation and had good attendance with appropriate patient spacing. Rental of Post 313 facilities is gradually returning, helping assure the continued financial stability of the Post.
