The Month of August is the Coast Guard's Birthday on August 4 and Purple Heart Day on August 12. We just had the Korean War Armistice Day, commemorating the end of the Korean War. The Korean War, which started June 25, 1950, ended on July 27, 1953. July 27, 2020 was National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day. We honor our Purple Heart Veterans and our Korean War Veterans for their service and sacrifice.

We should be preparing to watch young people going back to school, but it is not clear how and when schools will fully reopen. In the meantime, we check on each other. I saw Jackie Tribolet walking over to check on Andy Guralas. And I saw Gene Plocki by his car, getting ready to go somewhere. See the picture of Gene and his truck.

Meanwhile, thanks to Bob Gonzalez for assisting the Ross Valley Sanitary District in clearing a sewer line located under one of the oldest manholes in Marin County. Sean Stephens had called the Post asking for someone to coordinate with the Sanitary District. Bob Gonzalez met the workers and helped remove the manhole cover next to the clubroom wall under the dish rack. See the picture in this issue of Bob and the sewer brigade, who successfully removed two bricks that had fallen in, potentially clogging and backing up the Post sewer line.

We have also managed to process, almost certainly, an Economic Impact Disaster Loan from the Small Business Administration to offset some of the lost rental income resulting from the Covid19 Pandemic. Thanks to Office Manager Leslie Barker and Bob Gonzalez who spent hours developing our application.

We are also continuing to accept American flags which have been used to a point where they are no longer in good condition. We hope to provide these to Ray Mullin through the Marin United Veterans Council for proper disposal. If you look up, you can see a new American Flag flying over the Blue Rock

and Left Bank Restaurant. Their new flag was raised in time for the Fourth of July. And despite the pandemic, we will resume sending care packages to troops deployed overseas, in countries as far as Afghanistan, Kuwait, Egypt, Poland, Norway and ships at sea.

On July 20 House lawmakers passed legislation designed to give additional grants for housing upgrades to disabled veterans, sending the measure to the president to be signed into law. The Senate also approved an addition to its defense policy bill to expand the Department of Veterans Affairs' list of diseases considered related to exposure to Agent Orange, adding bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism.
